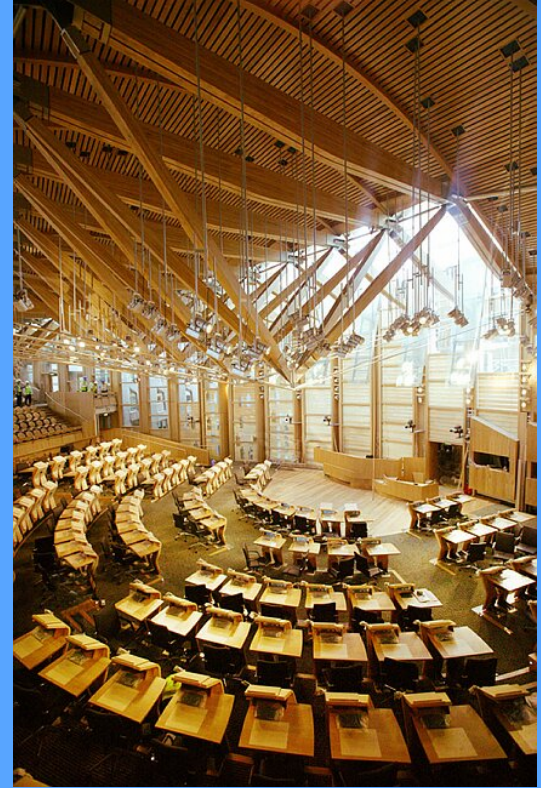
# NPF2 Participation: Issues and Challenges

- Alignment within Government

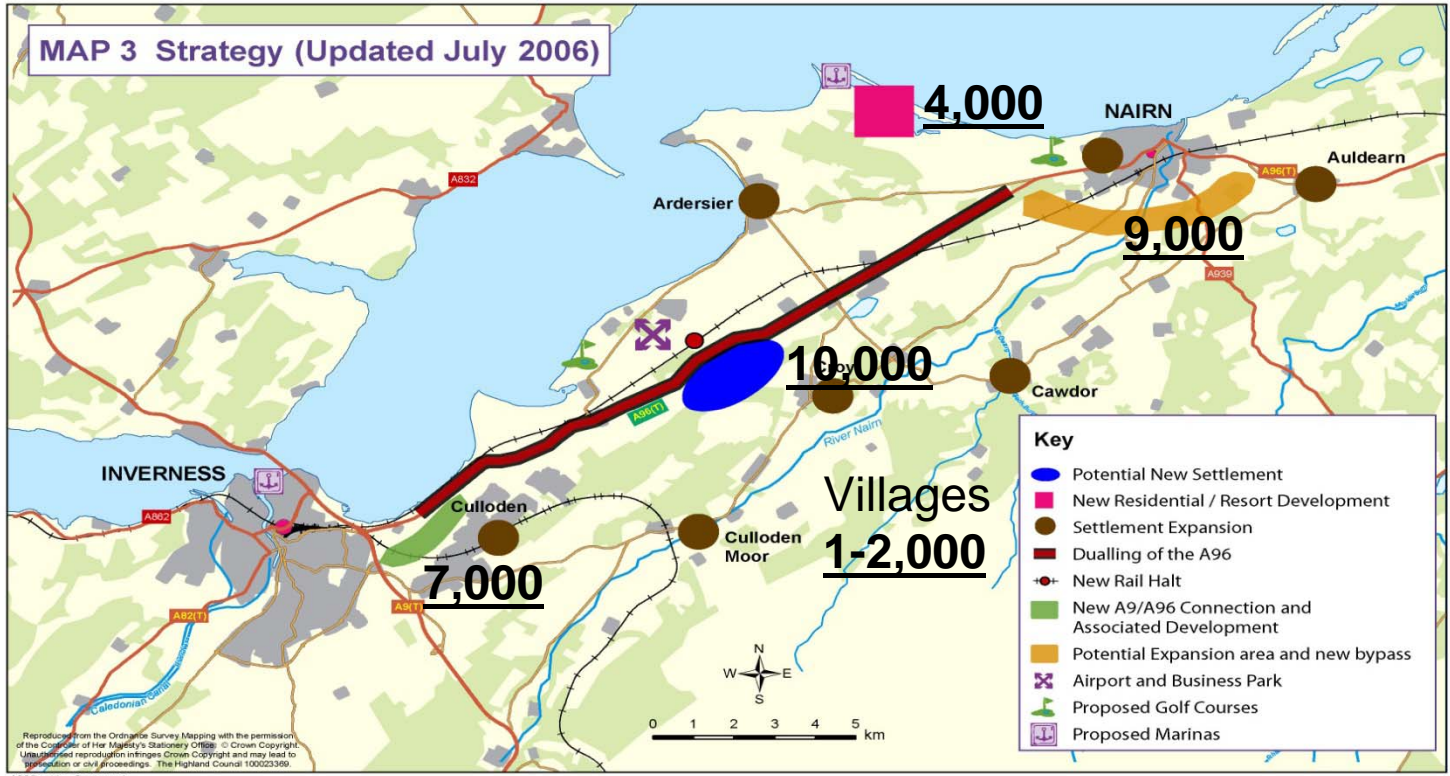


# Key Issues from the Consultation

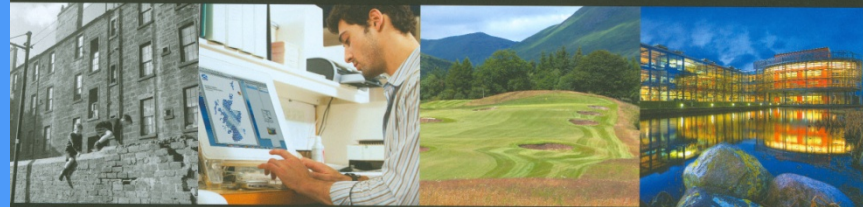
